

F.A.Q. ABOUT VOTING

FOR FANSHAWE STUDENTS

Q1. What age do I have to be to vote?

A1. At least 18 years of age on election day of October 19 2015.

Q2. Do I have to register before the election day in order to vote?

A2. If you are not on the voter list, or you have never voted before, you will need to register on or before election day. You can check if you are on the list at the Elections Canada website (www.elections.ca) by using the "Am I registered to vote" in the "My voter information" section of the homepage.

Q3. When and where do I register?

A3. You can register on-campus as follows:

Monday Oct. 5 from noon to 4 p.m. in Forwell Hall, Student Union Building, and the F Building hallway

Wednesday Oct. 7 from noon to 4 p.m. in the Student Centre/Oasis, and the T Building hallway

You may also register to vote before election day online, or at the Returning Office for the riding where you consider your home to be. If not registered on election day you can only register to vote at the polling site your address is assigned. This information can be found on the Election Canada website.

Q4. When and where do I vote?

A4. If you live in a Fanshawe College Residence, you can vote on campus in the Student Centre by the Oasis on election day Oct. 19 from 9:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m.

If you do not live in a Fanshawe College Residence, you cannot vote at the on-campus polling station. You can find your voting location at the following:

1) The polling site listed on the Voter Info Card that was mailed to your off-campus London address.

OR

2) Online at <http://www.elections.ca> by entering your postal code in the "My voter information" section of the homepage, and selecting "Where do I vote" in the next window.

Q5. How do I prove that I live in Residence?

A5. The college will provide a list to the registration table at the Student Centre by the Oasis on election day Oct. 19 from 9:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m., and will have the same list at each of the voter registration tables.

Q6. Can I vote for a candidate in my home riding?

A6. Yes, and there are two options.

1) If you are going home for the Thanksgiving holiday, the advance polling will be opened from Friday, Oct. 9 to Monday, Oct. 12 from 12 p.m. to 8 p.m.

2) You can vote by Special Ballot before 6 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 13, 2015 at your Returning Office Location.

Q7. What identification do I need in order to register and vote?

A7. Note that you will need proof of age in order to register.

1) Show one of these pieces of ID

- your driver's licence
- your provincial or territorial ID card
- any other government card with your photo, name and current address

OR

2) Show two pieces of ID

At least one must have your current address

- health card
- Canadian passport
- birth certificate
- certificate of Canadian citizenship
- citizenship card
- social insurance number card
- Indian status card
- band membership card
- Métis card
- card issued by an Inuit local authority
- Canadian Forces identity card
- Veterans Affairs health card
- old age security card
- hospital card
- medical clinic card
- label on a prescription container
- identity bracelet issued by a hospital or long-term care facility
- blood donor card
- CNIB card
- credit card
- debit card
- employee card
- student identity card
- public transportation card
- library card
- liquor identity card
- parolee card
- firearms licence
- licence or card issued for fishing, trapping or hunting
- utility bill (e.g. electricity; water; telecommunications services including telephone, cable or satellite)
- bank statement
- credit union statement
- credit card statement
- personal cheque
- government statement of benefits
- government cheque or cheque stub
- pension plan statement
- residential lease or sub-lease
- mortgage contract or statement
- income tax assessment
- property tax assessment or evaluation
- vehicle ownership
- insurance certificate, policy or statement
- correspondence issued by a school, college or university
- letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee
- targeted revision form from Elections Canada to residents of long-term care facilities
- letter of confirmation of residence from a First Nations band or reserve or an Inuit local authority
- letter of confirmation of residence, letter of stay, admission form or statement of benefits from one of the following designated establishments:
 - student residence
 - seniors' residence
 - long-term care facility
 - shelter
 - soup kitchen

We accept e-statements and e-invoices. Print them or show them on a mobile device.

OR

3) If your ID does not have your current address, take an oath

Show **two** pieces of ID with your name and have someone who knows you attest to your address. This person must show proof of identity and address, be registered in the same polling division, and attest for only one person.

**We accept ID cards and documents issued in their original formats. For documents issued electronically (such as e-statements/e-invoices), you may show them on a mobile device or printouts
